
#### **Home & School Connection**

#### Invite & Inform

School staff should proactively and intentionally contact students & families to invite them to engage in school activities and inform them of resources and opportunities. This contact should be individualized to get to know family needs and invite them as partners with school staff. Proactive communication not only establishes a positive and cooperative school culture but increases opportunities for communication of student needs.



#### **Additional Considerations:**

- This activity should be tracked to ensure all families are contacted and engaged.
- Provide guidance for staff regarding the topics shared during this contact to ensure key information is provided to all families.
- Complete this process at the start of each year and mid-year.
- After initial contact, ongoing communication from the campus should take place through email, newsletters, website, and social media.

#### Ideas for Initial Contact

### **Examples**

Teachers host "office hours" in the week before school begins. Families sign up for 15-minute personal meetings, allowing opportunity for teachers to meet and greet each family.

Teachers, counselors, and administrators implement "welcome walks" and visit the home of each student to welcome them to the new school year.

All advisory teachers (or another designated class period) contact the families of students in that class by phone call within the first 3 weeks of the school year. New families are called w/in a week of registration.

Sport, club, and activity advisors contact the families of their students. Families for students not involved in any school-sponsored activities are contacted by the counselor. During the counselor contact, information on activities the student may consider joining at the campus are provided.

Families are invited to attend small-sized virtual meetings offered at multiple times & dates in the week before school. These are hosted by counselors, campus leaders, and teachers. Break-out rooms are utilized to allow families a chance to ask questions in a smaller group. Any families that do not attend one of these are contacted individually by phone.
